Career Shadowing

Career Shadowing Week, a BASICS program of the Blair County Chamber, provides all Blair County high school juniors the opportunity to shadow part of a day, observing and learning about career interests.

The program's success is attributed to several volunteer groups consisting of Chamber members, school contacts, and the business community. Chamber members volunteer to find host employers and coordinate the shadowing opportunities between the employers and the students. School contacts from each of the seven Blair County public schools help the students apply for the experience and guide them from beginning to end with the time-consuming tasks associated with the program. The business community agrees to host nearly 400 students. The entire process is accomplished through phone calls, emails, and an interactive database website.
