## Young Entrepreneurs Academy (YEA!)

The Young Entrepreneurs Academy, or YEA!, is a class that teaches students how to start and run their own business or non-profit organization. According to Royce Boyd, the program's manager, "The goal of YEA! is to bring the next generation of entrepreneurs into Blair County."

Begun in 2017, YEA! accepts applications through July from interested students grade 6 through 12 from any Blair County school. Applicants are interviewed by the program's team of educators and business professionals, and then students for the upcoming class are invited to enroll. Offered locally at Penn State Altoona's Sheetz Entrepreneurial Center, the class begins in October and continues for 26 weeks until the end of April.

The YEA! class provides students with introductions to local entrepreneurs and

business leaders; exciting field trips to businesses for a behind-thescenes experience; and meetings with attorneys, accountants, marketing professionals, graphic designers,

professionals, graphic designers, manufacturers, internet specialists, and more. All of the resources that students need to start their own businesses are provided. The class culminates with students preparing a real business plan and pitching their plan to investors for funding. Boyd describes it as "a different approach to learning by doing in the business world for students. YEA! is popular with
